THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 8) BILL, 2022

BILL

to authorise payment and appropriation of certain further sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala for the services of the financial year 2022-2023

Preamble.—WHEREAS, it is necessary to authorise payment and appropriation of certain further sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala for the services of the financial year 2022-23;

BE, it enacted in the Seventy-third Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

1. *Short Title.*—*This Act may be called the Kerala Appropriation (No. 8) Act, 2022.*

2. *Issue of ₹ 28,92,07,000 from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala for the services of the financial year 2022-2023.*—From and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala, there may be paid and applied sums not exceeding those specified in column (3) of the Schedule amounting in the aggregate to the sum of Rupees Twenty Eight Crore Ninty Two Lakh and Seven Thousand only towards defraying the several charges which will come in the course of payment during the financial year 2022-2023, in respect of the services and purposes specified in column (2) of the Schedule.

3. *Appropriation.*—The sums authorised to be paid and applied from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala by this Act shall be appropriated for the services and purposes specified in the Schedule in relation to the financial year 2022-2023.
