REPORT

This Report deals with the Action Taken by Government on the recommendations contained in the Hundred and Tenth Report of the Committee on Public Undertakings (2004-06) relating to Kerala State Detergents and Chemicals Limited based on the Report of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India for the years ended 31st March, 2000 and 31st March, 2001 (Commercial) which was presented to the House on 2nd July, 2001 and 15th March, 2002.

The Report contained three recommendations. Government have furnished replies to all recommendations. The Committee (2011-14) considered the replies received from Government at its meeting held on 5th December, 2012.

The replies to the recommendations 1(2) and 2(4 & 5) were accepted by the Committee with remarks. These recommendations and its replies and the remarks form Chapter I of the Report.

Due to various operational issues, the Kerala State Detergents and Chemicals Ltd. declared as a Sick Industrial Company under BIFR in 1993. Even though Government have considered several proposals to revive this unit since then unfortunately no proposal was materialised. Subsequently the BIFR in their orders dated 18-11-2003 have recommended the High Court of Kerala to initiate steps to wind up the Company. During 2004 to 2008 period, the recommendation for winding up was pending in the High Court. The Government have decided in 2008 to close down the unit as it was not viable, and to lease out the entire land and building and plant and machinery to KINFRA for developing an Industrial park.
