**Statement under Rule 300**

On June 21, 1999 the Chief Minister made a statement regarding the Report of the Justice V. Bhaskaran Nambiar Commission of Inquiry which inquired into the allegation of corruption relating to the execution of Diesel Power Project at Brahmapuram.

On July 7, 1999, Shri T. K. Ramakrishnan, Minister for Fisheries and Rural Development made a statement on the Cultural Policy of the State Government.

*Question of Breach of Privileges:*

On July 22, 1999 the Speaker withheld consent to the following notices of question of Breach of Privileges:

(1) Notice given by Shri Johny Nelloor against Shri T. Sivadasa Menon, Minister for Finance alleging that the latter had misled the House by announcing that an amount of Rs. 130 lakhs was given as loan from contingency fund to solve the drinking water shortage in Alappuzha Town.

(2) Notice given by Shri K. P. Rajendran against Prof. Savithri Lekshmanan alleging that the latter along with a group of people had used abusive language against Shri Lonappan Nambadan, M.L.A. in front of his House and threatened to kill him.

(3) Notice given by Shri P. C. George against Shri K. M. Mani on the basis of the speech made by the latter in the Assembly on March 5, 1997.

(4) Notice given by Shri E. M. Augusthy against Shri P. J. Joseph, Minister for Education and Works alleging that the reply given by the Minister to Unstarred Question No. 3253 dated 18-2-1999 was devoid of facts.

(5) Notice given by Shri Johny Nelloor against Shri T. K. Ramakrishnan, Minister for Fisheries and Rural Development alleging that the reply given by the Minister to Unstarred Question No. 840 dated 1-2-1999 was false.

2. Speaker informed the House that the following notices of question of breach of Privilege were at different stages of consideration of the Chair:

(1) Notice given by Smt. J. Mercykutty Amma against Malayala Manorama Daily alleging that the report of Proceedings published on June 30 and July 1, 1999 were falsehood.

(2) Notice given by Dr. M. A. Kuttappan against Shri T. Sivadasa Menon, Minister for Finance alleging that the statement given by the Minister in the House on June 28, 1999 was incorrect.

(3) Notice given by Shri Johny Nelloor against the correspondent, Publisher and Chief Editor of Desabhimani Daily alleging that the Reports with title "കുറ്റം ചെയ്ത അന്ധൻ അന്ധനായി" published in it on July 16, 1999 was a Breach of Privilege of the Members.

(4) Notice given by Shri P. Raghavan against Malayala Manorama Daily alleging that it had published the expunged portion of Proceedings on June 24, 1999.

(5) Notice given by Shri P. Raghavan against the Printer and Publisher, Managing Editor and Associated Editor of Malayala Manorama Daily alleging that the editorial of the paper dated July 8, 1998 was defamatory to the Assembly.

(6) Notice given by Shri K. A. Chandran against Shri T. Sivadasa Menon, Minister for Finance alleging that the answer given to Unstarred Question No. 2584 dated July 14, 1999 was incorrect.

## **III. Reference of Bills to Subject Committees and Presentation of Subject Committee Reports**

Four Bills were referred to Subject Committee and Subject Committee Reports presented thereon. Details of such Bills are given in Appendix VII.

The Guruvayoor Devaswom (Amendment) Bill, 1999 was referred to Subject Committee on 21-6-1999 and the Subject Committee Report was presented on 14-7-1999. The Subject Committee Report was not taken into consideration by the House and hence the Bill was not passed. (90 Members had given amendments before the Bill was referred to Subject Committee).

## **IV. Reference of Bill to Select Committee**

The Kerala Sports Bill, 1999 was introduced in the House on 19-7-1999 and was referred to a Select Committee headed by the Minister for Health and Sports, on the same day. 21 Members including the Minister for Health and Sports participated in the general discussion on the Bill, Assembly devoted one hour and 47 minutes for the discussion.

## V. Financial Business

### 1. Budget for 1999-2000

The discussion and Voting on Demands for Grants for the financial year 1999-2000 was commenced on 22nd June, 1999. 13 days were allotted for discussion on Demand for Grants. 34 Demands were discussed in the House. 9 Demands were guillotined on 13th July, 1999.

Out of 1053 cut motions received, 1004 were moved and disposed of. There were 246 occasions for speech in connection with the discussion and Voting on Demands for Grants including reply by the Ministers. The Assembly devoted 70 hours and 8 minutes for transacting financial business relating to the Budget, for 1999-2000. The details are given in Appendix VIII.

The Kerala Appropriation (No. 8) Bill, 1999 in respect of the Budget for the year 1999-2000 was introduced in the Assembly on 15th July, 1999 and was taken into consideration and passed on the same day.

### 2. Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 1999-2000

On 16th July 1999, Shri T. Sivadasa Menon, Minister for Finance laid the Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 1999-2000 in the House. The discussion and voting on Supplementary Demands for Grants took place on 20th July, 1999. The Assembly devoted 5 hours and 3 minutes for the Business. 18 members participated in the discussion.

The Kerala Appropriation (No. 9) Bill, 1999 in respect of Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 1999-2000 was introduced in the Assembly on 22nd July, 1999 and was taken into consideration and passed on the same day.

## Private Members' Business

According to the Calendar of sittings of the Eleventh Session of the Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly, five days i.e., June 25, 1999, July 2, 9, 16 and 23, 1999 were earmarked for Private Members' Business. But the B.A.C. held on July 8, 1999, it was decided to adjourn the Assembly Session on July 22, 1999 and hence July 23, 1999 was lost for Private Members' Business. Out of the four days, two days i.e., June 25, 1999 and July, 9, 1999 were set down for Private Members' Bills and the other two days i.e. July 2 and 16, 1999, for Private Members' Resolutions.

*Private Members' Bills*

During the Session five motions for leave to introduce bills have come up before the House. All the bills were opposed by the Ministers concerned. Discussion on all but one bill was inconclusive. The motion for leave to introduce one of the bills was withdrawn by leave of the House. Besides, discussion was resumed on four pending bills. The motions for leave to introduce all the four bills were withdrawn by leave of the House.

Details regarding the name of members who moved the motion for leave to introduce the bills and the result thereof are given in Appendix IX and X.

*Private Members' Resolutions*

During the Session notice was given for six resolutions by Smt. R. Lathadevi, Shri M. Dasan, Shri Cherkalam Abdullah, Shri P. Raju, Shri E. M. Augusthy and Shri C. K. Rajendran respectively. But the resolutions of Shri M. Dasan, Shri Cherkalam Abdullah, Shri E. M. Augusthy and Shri C. K. Rajendran were not moved due to want of time. The resolutions of Smt. R. Latha Devi was passed unanimously while that of Shri P. Raju was withdrawn by leave of the House.

## APPENDIX VI

SALIENT FEATURES OF THE BILLS PASSED DURING  
THE ELEVENTH SESSION**1. The Kerala Appropriation (No. 8) Bill, 1999**

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys required to meet the expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State and the grants made by the Legislative Assembly in respect of the estimated expenditure of the Government of Kerala for the Financial Year 1999-2000.

**2. The Payment of Salaries and Allowances (Amendment) Bill, 1999**

As per sub-section (2) of section 6 of the Payment of Salaries and Allowances Act, 1951 (14 of 1951), the Ministers, the Speaker, the Deputy Speaker, the Leader of the Opposition and the Chief Whip shall be paid a consolidated sum of Rs. 850 per month in lieu of the cost of petrol and oil for the conveyances for the journeys performed within the city of Trivandrum and radius of 8 Kms. thereof. It is proposed to enhance the amount to Rs. 1850.

2. As per clause (aa) of sub-section (1) of section 8 of the Act every member of the Legislative Assembly other than the Ministers, the Speaker, the Deputy Speaker, the Leader of the Opposition and the Chief Whip shall be entitled to receive a consolidated sum of Rs. 1500 per month, for meeting his expenditure for the performance of his duties as such member in his Assembly constituency. It is proposed to enhance the amount to Rs. 250.

3. As per the proviso to clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 8 of the Act a member other than the Ministers, the Speaker, the Deputy Speaker, the Leader of the Opposition and the Chief Whip shall be entitled to receive a minimum of Rs. 3000 per month towards travelling allowance for journeys inside the State. It is proposed to enhance the amount to Rs. 4500.

4. As per sub-section (5) of section 8A of the Act, a member other than the Speaker, the Deputy Speaker, the Leader of the Opposition, the Chief Whip and the Ministers shall be entitled to a Telephone allowance of Rs. 2000 per month in addition to the rental of the telephone for meeting its charges. It is proposed to enhance the Telephone Allowances to Rs. 3000.

5. As per sub-items (a) and (b) of items (1) and (2) of Paragraph I of the Schedule to the Act the Ministers, the Speaker, the Deputy Speaker, the Leader of the Opposition and the Chief Whip shall be given travelling

allowance for journeys by road inside the State at the rate of Rs. 3 per kilometre and a daily allowance at the rate of Rs. 100 and for journeys outside the State a travelling allowance at the rate of Rs. 2 per kilometre and daily allowance at the rate of Rs. 150. It is proposed to enhance the rates for travelling allowance by road inside and outside the State to Rs. 4 per kilometre and daily allowance for halt at the rate of Rs. 300.

6. As per item (1) in Paragraph III of the Schedule to the Act the members of the Legislative Assembly shall be given daily allowance for travel inside the State at the rate of Rs. 75 and under item (2) they are entitled for daily allowance at the rate of Rs. 100 for travel outside the State. It is proposed to enhance the said daily allowance to Rs. 200.

7. It is decided to amend the Act suitable for the above purposes.

8. The Bill seeks to amend the Payment of Salaries and Allowances Act to achieve the above objects.

### **3. The Kerala Finance Bill, 1999**

The Bill seeks to amend the following enactments to give effect to certain financial proposals of the Government of Kerala for the financial year 1999-2000, namely: -

1. The Kerala Surcharge on Taxes Act, 1957 (11 of 1957);
2. The Kerala General Sales Tax Act, 1963 (15 of 1963);
3. The Kerala Building Tax Act, 1975 (7 of 1975);
4. The Kerala Agricultural Income Tax Act, 1991 (15 of 1991);
5. The Kerala Tax on Entry of Goods into Local Areas Act, 1994 (15 of 1994).

### **4. The Kerala Stay of Eviction Proceedings Bill, 1999**

Numerous proceedings are pending before the Land Tribunals, the Taluk Land Board, the State Land Board, the Courts, the Revenue Authorities or other Authorities wherein small holders and cultivating tenants who purchased or otherwise acquired land for consideration, evidenced by registered documents or otherwise are under threat of eviction or dispossession, on the ground that the lands so purchased or acquired by them are excess land to be surrendered under the provisions of the Kerala Land Reforms Act, 1963.

2. There have been persistent demands from the general public and organisations to protect such small holders and cultivating tenants, who are purchasers of such land, from eviction or dispossession.

3. In order to protect such small holders and cultivating tenants from eviction or dispossession, pending enactment of a legislation protecting their rights and interests on such land for a temporary period of one year, the Kerala Stay of Eviction Proceedings Act, 1998 (5 of 1998) was enacted. The period of operation of the afore-said enactment expired on the 30th March, 1999.

4. Some more time is required for enacting a legislation to protect the rights and interests of such small holders and cultivating tenants on such land. Difficulties will arise if such small holders and cultivating tenants are evicted or dispossessed from such land before the legislation to protect their rights are made. Therefore in public interest it was decided to give temporary protection of such small holders and cultivating tenants who had purchased lands which are subsequently found as excess land to be surrendered under the provisions of Kerala Land Reforms Act, 1963 from the threat of eviction from, or dispossession of such land. The temporary protection is intended only for a period of two years during which period it is proposed to amend the provisions of the Kerala Land Reforms Act, 1963 suitably to protect their rights and interest on such land.

5. This Bill is intended to achieve the above object.

**5. The Kerala Appropriation (No. 9) Bill, 1999**

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204(1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to authorise payment and appropriation of certain further sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala required to meet the supplementary expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala and the Grants made by the Legislative Assembly for the expenditure of the Government of Kerala for the financial year 1999-2000.
