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APPENDIX VI

Salient features of Bills transacted during the Twelfth Session

1. The Kerala Co-operative Societies (Amendment) Bill, 1999:

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The policy of the Government is to re-organise the co-operative societies as self governing democratic institutions. Government have, therefore, decided to bring comprehensive amendments to the Kerala Co-operative Societies Act, 1969.

- 2. At present, there is no provision in the Kerala Co-operative Societies Act, 1969 to enable an applicant for registration under section 6 or for amendment of the bye-laws under section 12 or for membership under section 16 of the said Act, to represent before the Registrar or the Government as the case may be, in cases where a final decision has not been taken within the prescribed period. Government have decided to include provisions for these purposes. So also, Government have decided to include provisior to enable a local authority to become a member in a society and a hospital co-operative society to admit industrial and commercial establishments and approved organisations as members. It is also decided to incorporate provisions for cessation of membership of those who are not active members.
- 3. It is not necessary, at present, to affiliate a Primary/Central/Federal Co-operative Society, to the concerned Apex Society. Government consider it necessary to include provision for such affiliation.
- 4. It was also decided to provide that a member admitted, within sixty days, prior to the date of election, shall not have the right to vote, as steps for the conduct of election have to be initiated at least two months prior to the date of election. It is also decided to modify the restriction on share holdings, by altering the existing ceiling of rupees five thousand, mentioned in section 22.
- 5. According to the existing provisions, the term of an elected committee of a society is three years. It would cost more financial strair on the societies to conduct election at every three years. In the better interests of the societies Government have decided to enhance the said term as five years. It is also decided to incorporate provision for the representation of one member from the affiliated societies in each revenue district to the committee of an Apex society and to limit the maximum number of members of the committee as eleven, in the case of a primary society and twenty five, in all other types of societies.
 - 6. Government have also decided to amend section 28A of the Act to provide for the representation of a woman and a member belonging to the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes in the committee of every society and for the nomination of such members, if there is no such representation.

- 7. It is also decided to constitute a State Co-operative Election Commission, which would be an independent body for the conduct of elections to co-operative societies.
- 8. Government have further decided to amend section 32 and section 33, to limit the number of administrators, to be appointed to manage the affairs of the society as three and to enhance the maximum period of the administrator as two years.
- 9. As part of the development of the co-operative sector, Government have decided to include provisions for the constitution of the Co-operative Development and Welfare Fund and for the formulation of the Deposit Guarantee Scheme and the Consortium Bending Scheme:
- 10. According to the existing provisions, the power of audit, inquiry, inspection and surcharge is vested with the Registrar. Government have decided to form a seperate wing for audit by appointing a Director of Cooperative Audit. Hence, provisions relating to audit and inquiry, inspection etc. have been decided to be incorporated as seperate chapter: Provisions for suspension of the committee; pending enquiry, has also been decided to be included therein:
- 11. Government have decided to appoint a Vigilance Officer, not below the rank of a Deputy Inspector General of Police, to enquire into and investigate all offences under the Act.
- 12. It is further decided to substitute Chapter IX relating to settlement of disputes, so as to empower the Co-operative Arbitration Court, to settle non-monetary disputes and the Registrar to settle monetary disputes.
- 13. At present, recruitment of officers and servants, in the Primary Agricultural Credit Societies, Primary Credit Societies, Urban Co-operative Banks and Primary Co-operative Agricultural and Rural Development Banks, is made by the societies themselves. It has came to the notice of the Government that such recruitments are not made strictly in accordance with the provisions of the Act and the rules made thereunder and has resulted in wide spread criticism and complaint. Government have, therefore, decided to entrust such recruitment to an independent body by constituting a Co-operative Service Recruitment, Board.

- 14. Consequent on the constitution of Co-operative Arbitration Court, it has become necessary to amend section 82 to provide for appeal against orders of the Co-operative Arbitration Court to the Tribunsh
- 15. As part of the decentralised Planning Programme, it is considered necessary to bring the local authorities also with the purview of the State Co-operative Union and to entrust the State Co-operative Union to conduct training programmes for employees of co-operative societies and to ensure their participation therein.
- 16. Government consider that the penalties provided for the offences mentioned in section 94 are insufficient to prevent such offences and hence decided to enhance the same.
 - 17. The Bill seeks to achieve the above objects.
- 2. The Kerala Appropriation (No. 10) Bill, 1999:

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204(1) of the Constituion of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to authorise payment, and appropriation of certain further sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala required to meet the supplementary expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala and the grants made by the Legislative Assembly for the expenditure of the Government of Kerala for the financial year 1999-2000.

3. The Kerala Infrastructure Investment Fund Bill, 1999:

Infrastructure development is a sine que non for economic progress. Infrastructure projects, require massive capital expenditure: In the past, these were met almost wholly from budgetary sources. However, the range of infrastructure projects now demanded in a State and the scale of investment that this calls for, the budget of a State can no longer accommodate the requirements. Most States have resorted to extra-budgetary sources for financing infrastructure projects.

2. The State of Kerala has very large requirements in the major infrastructure sectors like Rower, Roads, Irrigation, Ports, Water Supply, Inland Navigation and Urban Infrastructure. Mobilisation of adequate funds to invest in vital infrastructure projects has been a subject for consideration of the Government for some time.

- 3. The Ninth Five Year Plan is in its third year of implementation. The State has set itself definite development targets and needs to achieve them in the remaining two years. Hence a fund has to be set up urgently and mobilisation of resources undertaken without any delay. Therefore Government proposed to implement the decision immediately.
- 4. As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and as the above proposal had to be brought into force immediately the Kerala Infrastructure Investment Fund Ordinance, 1999 was promulgated by the Governor on the 11th day of November, 1999 and was published as Ordinance No. 5 of 1999 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 2072 dated the 11th November, 1999.
- 5. The Bill seeks to replace the Ordinance No. 5 of 1999 by an Act, of the State Legislature.

4. The Kerala Lok Ayukta (Amendment) Bill, 1999:

According to sub-section (1) of Section 22 of the Kerala Lok Ayukta Act, 1999 (8 of 1999), every public servant other than a Government Servant shall, within six months after the commencement of the said Act, and thereafter before the 30th day of June, once in two years, submit to the competent authority in the prescribed form a statement of his assets and liabilities and those of the members of the family. The period of six months specified in section 22 for filing the statement expired on 14th May, 1999. The form of statement of assets and liabilities and the competent authority in respect of certain categories of public servants could not be prescribed before the expiry of the said period. Hence, the public servants could not file their statements as specified in section 22 of the Act within the specified time. In the above circumstances, Government have decided to extend the period for filing statement of assets and liabilities under Section 22 of the Kerala Lok Ayukta Act, 1999, by six months from 15th May, 1999, by making suitable amendments in the Act.

- 2. As the Legislative Assembly of the State of Kerala was not in session and as the proposal had to be given effect to immediately, the Kerala Lok Ayukta (Amendment) Ordinance, 1999 was promulgated by the Governor on the 29th day of September, 1999 and the same was published as Ordinance No. 3 of 1999 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 1768 dated the 30th September, 1999.
- 3. The period as so extended expired on 14th November, 1999. Since the Government could not prescribe the competent authority in respect of certain categories of public servants it is considered necessary to allow some more time for filing the statement. Accordingly Government have decided to make suitable modification in the Bill to replace the Ordinance so as to extend the time for a further period of six months.

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4. The Bill seeks to replace the Ordinance with the aforesaid modification by an Act of the State Legislature.

5. The Kerala Highway Protection Bill. 1999:

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It has been found that encroachments on highways and unrestricted use and development of adjoining lands causing damage to the highways are increasing. The existing laws are not sufficient for the prevention of such encroachments and damage caused to the highways.

- 2. The Government of India had circulated a model Bill intended for the protection of highways and regulation of highway developments, and for prevention of ribbon development and encroachments on highways. The Government of India have also suggested that the development of the lands adjoining the national highways shall also be regulated by the State Government by making necessary legislation.
- 3. Government have considered the matter in detail taking account the circumstances of the State and decided to make a legislation for the aforesaid purposes.
- 4. As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and as the proposal had to be given effect to immediately, the Kerala Highway Protection Ordinance, 1999 was promulgated by the Governor on the 17th day of November, 1999 and the same was published as Ordinance No. 6 of 1999 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 2093 dated the 17th November, 1999.
- 5. The Bill seeks to replace Ordinance No. 6 of 1999 by an Act of the State Legislature.
- 6. The Kerala Industrial Single Window Clearance Boards and Industrial Township Area Development Bill, 1999:

One of the factors discouraging potential investors is the relatively complex procedure and the multiplicity of agencies involved in giving clearances/licenses/certificates for setting up industrial undertakings in the State and the connected delays. The Government would therefore like to create statutorily empowerd Single Window Clearance Boards at the State level, district level and notified Industrial Areas with a view to providing entrepreneurs with a single contact point for obtaining the necessary clearances/licenses/certificates for establishing industrial units in the State within a prescribed time limit. This will help not only to simplify the procedures but also to make them time bound.

2. The Government have given emphasis to a cluster based approach for the industrial growth of the State and have been taking a series of steps for establishing both general and sector specific Parks in the State with all necessary infrastructure. It is hence vital that empowered Single Window Clearance Boards be set up in all such Industrial Areas so that the entrepreneurs can get at comprehensive package of assistance to set up units in these identified Industrial Areas.

- 3. The District Single Window Clearance Boards are proposed to be set up in all districts and would in a time bound manner give clearances/licenses/certificates for setting up Small Scale Industrial units in the various districts, in places other than the Industrial Areas. The State level Single Window Clearance Board would be empowered to give clearances/licences/certificates for starting of industrial units other than Small Scale Industries and units set up in the notified Industrial Areas. The State Level Board would also act as the Appellate body over the Industrial Areas and District Boards.
 - 4. This Bill is intended to achieve the above object.
