RESUME OF BUSINESS TRANSACTED DURING THE  
FIRST SESSION OF TENTH KERALA  
LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

The Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly was constituted on May 14, 1996 after the General Election held on April 27, 1996. The Ministry headed by Shri E. K. Nayanar assumed office in the afternoon of 20th May, 1996.

The summons dated May 23, 1996 for the First Session of the Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly was issued to members on 24-5-1996.

The Session commenced at 9.00 a.m. on Wednesday, May 29, 1996 and adjourned sine-die at 4.15 p.m. on Monday, July 29, 1996. There were altogether 14 days of sittings. The House transacted business for 78 hours and 30 minutes.

*Oath of office:*

The members assembled for swearing at 9.00 a.m. on Wednesday, May 29, 1996 in the Assembly Chamber, Thiruvananthapuram. Shri P. Ravindran who was appointed by the Governor to perform the duties of the Speaker under Article 180 (1) of the Constitution was in the Chair (Shri P. Ravindran took affirmation before the Governor on May 27, 1996). The Secretary informed the House that under Article 180 (1) of the Constitution, the Governor has appointed Shri P. Ravindran to perform the duties of the Speaker and that under Article 188 of the Constitution the Governor has appointed Shri P. Ravindran as the person before whom Members of the newly elected Legislative Assembly shall make and subscribe oath or affirmation according to the form set out for the purpose in the Third Schedule to the Constitution. One hundred and thirty-eight Members took oath or affirmation and signed the Roll of Members (Paralar Assembly seat was vacant due to the demise of the Shri P. K. Sreenivasan).

*Governor's Address:*

The Governor Addressed the Members of the Legislative Assembly at 9.30 a.m. on July 12, 1996. The discussion on the Motion of Thanks to the Governor's Address commenced on July 16, 1996 with Shri S. Sarma moving the following motion:

The discussion on the Motion of Thanks lasted for 3 days viz., July 16, 17 and 18, 1996. The Motion of Thanks was adopted on July 18, 1996. The House devoted 18 hours and 26 minutes for the discussion on Motion of Thanks and 59 Members participated in the discussion.

The Governor's reply to the Motion of Thanks was reported to the House on July 24, 1996.

*Election of Speaker:*

Two Members, viz., Shri George J. Mathew and Shri M. Vijayakumar had been duly nominated as candidates for election as Speaker. The election was conducted at 9.30 a.m. on May 30, 1996 with Shri P. Ravindran Protem Speaker in the Chair. Shri George J. Mathew secured 58 votes and Shri M. Vijayakumar secured 77 votes. Shri M. Vijayakumar therefore declared elected as Speaker.

*Announcement regarding Leader of the House:*

On May 29, 1996 Speaker protem informed the House that, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-rule (1) of Rule 2 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Kerala Legislative Assembly, Shri T.K. Ramakrishnan, Minister for Fisheries and Rural Development, has been nominated as the Leader of the House by the Chief Minister.

*Recognition of Leader of Opposition:*

On May 30, 1996 the Speaker announced that Shri A.K. Antony, Leader of the Indian National Congress Legislature Party has been recognised as Leader of Opposition since his party is the largest one in the opposition.

*Announcement regarding Government Chief Whip:*

On May 30, 1996 Speaker informed the House that Shri T.K. Hamza is appointed as Government Chief Whip.

*Panel of Chairmen:*

*Announcement regarding resignation of seat in the Assembly:*

On July 12, 1996 the Speaker informed the House that Shri K.P. Mammoo Master elected from Tellicherry Constituency had resigned his seat in the Kerala Legislative Assembly with effect from July 1, 1996.

*Obituary Reference:*

On July 15, 1996 the Speaker made references to the demise of Shri Neelam Sanjiva Reddy, former President and Shri P.K. Sreerivasan, Member of the Kerala Legislative Assembly. Shri E. K. Nayanar, Chief Minister and Leaders of various political parties associated themselves with the sentiments expressed by the Chair. The House then adjourned without transacting any other business.

On July 29, 1996 the Speaker made reference to the demise of S/Shri C. P. Narayanan, N. K. Balakrishnan, P.A. Antony, T. Krishnan, Kallada Narayanan and Shri P. V. Sankaranarayanan who were members of the Kerala Legislative Assembly and of S/Shri V. P. P. Namboodiri, K. V. K. Warriar and K. Bhanu who were members of Travancore-Cochin Legislative Assembly and of Smt. Anna Chandu who was a Member of Sree Moolam Praja Sabha.

*Election of Deputy Speaker:*

On July 17, 1996 Speaker informed the House that four nominations have been received for the office of the Deputy Speaker nominating Shri C. A. Kurian. Shri C. A. Kurian was declared elected as Deputy Speaker.

*Questions:*

Details regarding the number of questions received, number of questions answered on the floor of the House etc., are given in Appendix I.

*Adjournment Motion:*

No Adjournment Motion was admitted during the Session. Details of Adjournment Motions in respect of which consent was withheld after hearing the views of Ministers concerned on the floor of the House are given in Appendix II.

*Calling Attention:*

During the Session Eighteen Statements were made by Ministers under Rule 62, details of which are given in Appendix III.

*Papers laid on the Table:*

*Motion for suspension of Rule :*

On July 24, 1996 Shri E. Chandrasekharan Nair, Minister for Food, Tourism and Law moved and the House adopted the following Motion:

*Half-an-hour discussion :*

On the same day Shri E. M. Augusthy raised a discussion on a matter of public importance arising out of the answer to starred question No. 99 dated 23-7-1996. The Minister for Electricity and Co-operation replied.

*Question of Breach of Privilege :*

### Financial Business

#### I. *Revised Budget for 1996-97:*

The Revised Budget for 1996-97 together with the Alteration Memorandum was presented by the Hon'ble Finance Minister on 19th July 1996. The general discussion commenced on 22nd July 1996. Three days were allotted for general discussion on the Budget. The House devoted 16 hours and 16 minutes for this business. 59 Members participated in the discussion.

## II. *Vote on Account:*

The Vote on Account for two months (August-September) for the Financial year 1996-97 was presented on 19th July 1996. The Minister for Finance moved the motion regarding Demands for Grants on Account towards defraying charges towards the months of August and September 1996-97 on 25th July 1996 and the discussion on the Vote on Account was held on the same day. The House devoted 3 hours and 56 minutes for this business. 22 Members including Minister for Finance participated in the discussion.

The Kerala Appropriation (Vote on Account No. 2) Bill, 1996 introduced on 29th July 1996 was taken into consideration and passed on the same day. The House devoted 2 hrs. and 11 minutes for discussion on the Bill and 11 Members participated in the discussion.

### **Private Members' Business**

According to the Calendar of Sittings of the 1st Session of the Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly, the Private Members' Business was set down for one day i.e., 26th July 1996. The day was set apart for transacting the business relating to Private Members' Bills.

#### *Private Members' Bills:*

Eight members moved motions for leave to introduce Bills, but the motions were opposed by the Ministers. Details regarding the names of Bills and name of members who moved the motions for leave to introduce the Bills are given in the Appendix V.

The House devoted 1 hour and 10 Minutes for transacting Private Members' Business.
