**RESUME OF BUSINESS TRANSACTED DURING THE SIXTEENTH  
SESSION OF TENTH KERALA LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY**

The summons for the Sixteenth Session of the Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly was issued on 5-2-2001. The Session commenced at 9.00 a.m. on Thursday, February 15, 2001 and adjourned sine-die at 6.40 p.m. on March 8, 2001. The House met on the following days viz, February 15, 16, 19, 20, 22, 23, 26, 27, 28, March 1, 2, 7 and 8, 2001 (13 sittings). The House transacted business for 79 hrs. 36 mts.

*Governor's Address:*

The Governor addressed the Members of the Legislative Assembly at 9.00 a.m. on Thursday, February 15, 2001. The discussion on the motion of thanks to the Governor's Address was commenced on February 19, 2001 with Shri N. Anirudhan moving the following motion:

**Financial Business.**

1. *Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 2000-2001*

On February 28, 2001 the Minister for Finance laid on the Table, the Supplementary Financial Statement for the year 2000-2001. Discussion and Voting on the Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 2000-2001, took place on 1-3-2001. 15 members including the Minister for Finance participated in the discussion. The Assembly devoted 5 hours and 17 minutes for the discussion and voting on the Supplementary Demands for Grants.

The Kerala Appropriation Bill, 2001 in respect of the Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 2000-2001 was introduced in the House by the Minister for Finance on 8-3-2001. The Bill was taken into consideration and passed on the same day.

## 2. Budget for 2001-2002

The Budget for 2001-2002 was presented by the Finance Minister on February 23, 2001. The General discussion took place on February 27 and 28, 2001. 38 Members (including Ministers) participated in the discussion.

## 3. Demands for Vote on Account for the year 2001-2002.

The Vote on Account for the four months of the year 2001-2002 (April to July 2001) was presented on February 23, 2001 along with the Budget. Discussion and Voting on Vote on Account took place on March 7, 2001. A total number of 355 cut motions were received for the motions for various Demands for Grants on Account. 18 Members including the Minister for Finance participated in the discussion. The Assembly devoted 6 hours 22 minutes for the discussion and voting.

The Kerala Appropriation (Vote on Account) Bill, 2001 in respect of the Demands for Grants for the four months (April to July 2001) of the Financial Year 2001-2002 was introduced in the House by the Minister for Finance on 8-3-2001. The Bill was taken into consideration and was passed on the same day.

### *Private Members Business:*

According to the Calendar of Sittings of the Sixteenth Session of the 10th Kerala Legislative Assembly only one day i.e., March 2, 2001 was earmarked for transacting Private Members Business. As per the directions in the Bulletin Part II No. 271 dated 10th May, 1993, Private Members' Bills were considered by the House on that day.

On March 2, 2001 nineteen motions for leave to introduce Bills have come up before the House. All the Bills were opposed by the Ministers concerned. Besides this discussion was resumed for only one pending Bill due to the limitation of time, even though three Bills were listed out and included in the list of Business. At the end of the discussion on the Bill, the same was withdrawn by the leave of the House in the light of the assurance given by the Minister concerned.

**2. THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (VOTE ON ACCOUNT)  
BILL, 2001**

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 206 thereof, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys required to meet the expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State and the grants made in advance by the Legislative Assembly in respect of the estimated expenditure of the Government of Kerala for a part of the Financial Year 2001-2002.
