RESUME OF BUSINESS TRANSACTED DURING THE FIFTH SESSION OF THE TENTH KERALA LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

The summons for the Fifth Session of the Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly was issued on June 9, 1997. The Session commenced on June 23 and adjourned sine-die at 3.00 p.m. on July 29, 1997. There were altogether 21 days of sittings. The House transacted business for 437 hrs. and 48 mins. On July 9, 1997 Members belonging to the Opposition parties were not present as a mark of solidarity to the opposition sponsored State Health.

Obituary References:

On June 23 Speaker made a reference to the demise of V. K. Rajan, sitting member of Kerala Legislative Assembly and Minister for Agriculture. House adjourned for the day as a mark of respect to the deceased.

On July 14, 1997 the Speaker made references to the demise M. K. Kesavan, Member, Kerala Legislative Assembly and P. S. Sreedharan former Minister and former Member, Kerala Legislative Assembly.

Abstention/Boycott from the Question Hour:

V. Raghavan. Since the demand was not concurred, the members belonging to the Opposition abstained from asking questions during the Question hour.

Having failed to cause a discussion on the Report of K. Padmanabhan Nair Commission on Police Firing at Koothuparamba on 25-11-1994, suspending Question hour, the Members belonging to the Opposition boycotted the Question hour on July 8, 1997.

FINANCIAL BUSINESS

I. Budget for 1997-98

The discussion and voting on Demands for Grants in the Budget for the financial year 1997-98 was commenced on 24th June 1997. Thirteen days were allowed for discussion on Demands for Grants. 33 Demands were discussed in the House. 9 Demands were quilled on 22nd July, 1997.

Out of 901 Cui Motions received, 375 were moved and disposed of. There were 193 occasions for speech in connection with the discussion and voting on Demands for Grants including reply by Ministers. The Assembly devoted 57 hours and 12 minutes for transacting financial business relating to the Budget for 1997-98. The details are given in Appendix VII.

The Appropriation (No. 2) Bill, 1997 in respect of the Budget for the year 1997-98 was introduced in the Assembly on 24th July 1997 and was taken into consideration and passed on the same day.

II. *Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 1997-98*

On July 25, 1997 Hari T. Sivadasa Menon, Minister for Finance laid the Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 1997-98 in the House. The discussion and voting on Supplementary Demands for Grants took place on 28th July 1997. The Assembly devoted 4 hours and 45 minutes for the Business. 16 Members participated in the discussion.

The Kerala Appropriation (No. 3) Bill, 1997 in respect of Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 1997-98 was introduced in the Assembly on 29th July 1997 and was taken into consideration and passed on the same day.

Private Members Business

According to the Calendar of sittings of the Fifth Session of Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly, Private Members' Business was set down for 5 days. Of these, June 27, July 11 and July 25, 1997 were set apart for transacting Private Members' Bills and July 4 and July 18, 1997 were set apart for Private Members' Resolutions. But only one day's business i.e. on June 27, 1997 was transacted during the Session.

The Private Members' Business scheduled for July 11, 1997 could not be transacted since the House had cancelled the business due to the demise of M.K. Kesavan. The business on July 25, 1997 could not be transacted since the B.A.C. at their meetings held on 14-7-1997 had decided to take up Government business instead of Private Members' Business.

Private Members Bills

During the Session Six Motions for leave to introduce Bills came up before the House. The details of the Bills are shown in the statement appended.

Discussion on motion for leave to introduce four Bills was scheduled. But discussion on motions for leave to introduce only three bills could be resumed and discussions on two bills could be completed. The two bills were withdrawn by leave of the House on the basis of the replies given by the Ministers concerned. The continuation of discussion on the Bill "The Malayalam University Bill, 1997" could not be completed. The continuation of discussion on the Bill "The Palakkad District Paddy Development Authority Bill, 1996" could not be resumed due to the expiry of the scheduled business time on Friday.

The details regarding the names of Bills and the names of Members who moved the motions for leave to introduce the Bills and the result thereof are given in the Appendix VIII, IX and X.
