On July 1, 1998, Shri T. Sivadasan, Minister for Finance, laid on the Table the correction statement to the Table 27 of the Budget in Brief, 1998-99.

Condolence

On July 30, 1998, the House condolled the death of eight persons consequent on an air crash at Kochi.

Homage

On August 6, 1998, the day being observed as 'Hiroshima Day', House paid homage to the Victims of Atomic explosion at Hiroshima.

Announcement by the Speaker

On July 22, 1998, the Speaker informed the House that in view of Karkidakavaru the Assembly will meet at 9.30 a.m. on Thursday, July 23, 1998.

On August 9, 1998, the speaker informed the House that an exhibition Cricket match between Chief Minister's Eleven and the Speaker's Eleven will be played at University Stadium on August 13, 1998 in connection with the Golden Jubilee Celebrations of India's Independence.

Statement by the Speaker

On July 15, 1998, the Speaker expressed concern of the House over the delay in introducing the Women's Reservation Bill in Parliament.

On July 17, 1998, the Speaker stated that the unanimous sentiment of the House that the play "Mein Nathuram Godre Balihay" defaming the Father of the Nation be banned, will be communicated to the Central Government.

Statement under Rule 300

On July 2, 1998, Minister for Revenue made a statement on monsoon havoc in various parts of the state.

On July 6, 1998, the Chief Minister made a statement regarding the action taken by the Government on the Report of the Committee on decentralisation (See Committee Report).

On July 27, 1998, the Minister for Electricity and Co-operation made a statement regarding the energy policy of the State Government.

Question of Breach of Privilege

On August 6, 1998 the Speaker informed the House that the following notices of breach of privilege were under consideration.

- 1. Notice given by Shri P. C. George against Shri C. P. Udayabhanu Advocate, Ernakulam alleging that Shri Rishiraj Singh, Superintendent of Police, Kottayam had misbehaved at the meeting of the Committee on Petitions on 30-12-1997 and that Shri C. P. Udayabhanu had sent a suit notice against him while the above issue was pending consideration in the Committee of Privileges.
- 2. Notice given by Shri Palode Ravi against the Chief Minister alleging that the reported statement of the latter published in Desabhimani dated 3-7-1998 regarding the reference made in the Assembly about Mata Amritanandamayi Devi by Shri T. K. Hamza on 30-6-1998 was in violation of the ruling of the Chair and that it infringes upon the privilege of the House and the members thereof.
- 3. Notice given by Shri T. M. Jacob against the Chief Minister alleging that the reply given by the latter to a starred question on 29-6-1998 was contradictory to the earlier assurance given to the House.

(iii) *Reference of Bills to Subject Committee and presentation of Subject Committee Reports:*

Seven Bills were referred to Subject Committees and Subject Committee Reports presented thereto. Details of such Bills are given in Appendix VII.

Financial Business

1. *Budget for 1998-99:*

The discussion and Voting on Demands for Grants in the Budget for the Financial Year 1998-99 commenced on 30th June, 1998. 12 days were allotted for discussion on Demands for Grants, 55 Demands were discussed in the House. 9 Demands were guillotined on 22nd July, 1998.

Out of 1288 Cr. Motions received, 734 were moved and disposed of. There were 229 occasions for speech including reply by the Ministers in connection with the discussion and Voting on Demands for Grants. The Assembly devoted 59 hours and 20 minutes for transacting financial business relating to the Budget for 1998-99. The details are given in Appendix VIII.

The Appropriation (No. 2) Bill, 1998 in respect of the Budget for the year 1998-99 was introduced by the Minister for Finance on July 27, 1998. The Bill was taken into consideration and was passed on the same day. 17 members including the Minister for Finance participated in the discussion.

2. *Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 1998-99*

On July 28, 1998, the Minister for Finance laid the Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 1998-99. Discussion and Voting on the Supplementary Demands for Grants took place on July 30, 1998. The Assembly devoted 5 hours and 7 minutes for the Business.

- * The Kerala Appropriation (No. 3) Bill, 1998 in respect of Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 1998-99 was introduced in the Assembly on August 3, 1998. The Bill was taken into consideration and passed on the same day. 11 members including the Minister for Finance participated in the discussion.

Private Members' Business

According to the Calendar of Sittings of the Eighth Session of the Kerala Legislative Assembly, Private Members' Business was set down for four days i.e. July 18, 17, 24 and 31, 1998. Out of the above days, July 18 and 24 were set apart for Private Members' Bills and July 17 and 31 were set apart for Private Members' Resolutions.

A. *Private Members' Bills*

During the Session 12 motions for leave to introduce bills came up before the House. Besides, discussion on motion for leave to introduce 7 Bills were continued. Out of the above 12 Bills, one Bill was withdrawn by leave of the House on the basis of the assurance given by the Minister concerned and the other was declined. Again, discussion on two Bills were completed and were withdrawn by leave of the House.

The details regarding the name of Members who moved the motion for leave to introduce the Bills and the result thereof are given in Appendix IX and X.

Private Members' Resolutions

During the Session two resolutions given notice of by Shri T. K. Balan and Shri Sebastian Paul (authorised by Shri Venganoor P. Bhaskaran) were discussed and passed unanimously. The Resolution of Shri P. S. Supal was taken up and his speech was completed. Shri M. Dasar began his speech on the above resolution and was inconclusive in the amended form.

The details regarding the name of Members who moved the resolutions, the text of the resolution and the result thereof are given in Appendix XI.

The House devoted a total of 3 hours and 8 minutes for transacting the Private Members' Business and Members including Ministers participated in the discussion.

APPENDIX VI

SALIENT FEATURES OF IMPORTANT BILLS

1. THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 2) BILL, 1998

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the money required to meet the expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State and the Grants made by the Legislative Assembly in respect of the estimated expenditure of the Government of Kerala for the Financial Year 1998-99.

2. THE KERALA FINANCE BILL, 1998

The Bill seeks to amend the following enactments to give effect to certain financial proposals of the Government of Kerala for the financial year 1998-99, namely :—

1. The Kerala Land Tax Act, 1961 (13 of 1961)
2. The Kerala General Sales Tax Act, 1963 (15 of 1963)
3. The Kerala Motor Vehicles Taxation Act, 1976 (19 of 1976)
4. The Kerala Agricultural Income Tax Act, 1991 (15 of 1991)
5. The Kerala Tax on Entry of Goods into Local Areas Act, 1994 (15 of 1994)

3. THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 3) BILL, 1998

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204(1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to authorise payment and appropriation of certain further sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala required to meet the supplementary expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala and the Grants made by the Legislative Assembly for the expenditure of the Government of Kerala for the financial year 1998-99.

4. THE PLANTATIONS LABOUR KERALA (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1997

The benefit of free medical aid as per section 10 of the Plantations Labour Act, 1951 are not available to the parents and unmarried daughters of the female workers. The Plantations Labour Committee and the Kerala Plantations Labour Medical Advisory Board has recommended the Government

to extent the medical facilities provided under section 10 of the Plantations Labour Act, 1951 to the parents and unmarried daughters of the female workers also. The Government have considered the recommendation and have decided to amend the said Act to extend the free medical benefits available under the said Act to the parents and unmarried daughters of the female workers.

2. The Bill seeks to amend the Plantations Labour Act in its application to the State of Kerala to achieve the above object.

3. THE KERALA RATION DEALERS' WELFARE FUND BILL, 1997

1. There have been persistent demands from the ration dealers in the State that there should be a Welfare Fund for the ration dealers and their families. Having examined this aspect, it is felt that a Ration Dealers' Welfare Fund should be set up. It is also felt that the benefit from the Fund should be restricted to retail ration dealers only:

2. Adequate security or given to members, right state of insurance in the Welfare Fund in the event of death of a member of the fund. It is also necessary to give financial assistance to members who suffer from permanent disablement or disability and also compensation for losses suffered in the ration business for reasons beyond their control. The Fund should also be utilized to give loans and advances to members for improvement of their ration business.

3. The fund will be raised by way of contributions from the members directly or otherwise, grants from the Government, borrowings etc.

4. With a view to achieve the above said objectives the Kerala Ration Dealers' Welfare Fund Bill, 1997 was published as Bill No. 57 of the Kerala Legislative Assembly and it was introduced in the Assembly on 31st March, 1997 and on the same day, it was referred to the Subject Committee for consideration. The Bill was examined by the Subject Committee which met on 22nd August, 1997 and was approved with certain modifications.

The Kerala Ration Dealers' Welfare Fund Bill, 1997 as reported by the Subject Committee, could not be considered or passed by the Legislative Assembly in the Session which started on 13th March, 1998 and ended on 23rd April, 1998, due to lack of time.

5. The ration dealers in the State are on the war-path. Constitution of a Welfare Fund is one of their demands. The delay in the constitution of Welfare Fund will invite protest from the ration dealers and consequent disruption of the public distribution system.

6. As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and as the proposal had to be given effect immediately, the Kerala Ration Dealers' Welfare Fund Ordinance, 1998 was promulgated by the Governor on the 10th day of June 1998 and published as Ordinance number 10 of 1998 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 895 dated 10th June, 1998.

The Bill seeks to replace the said Ordinance by an Act of the State Legislature.

6. THE KERALA STATE RURAL DEVELOPMENT BOARD (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1998

The Kerala State Rural Development Board is a statutory body constituted by the Government under the provisions of the Kerala State Rural Development Board Act, 1971. In G.O. (Ma.) 27/96/IAD dated 9-2-1996 orders were issued by the Government introducing pension scheme as per Part III of the Kerala Service Rules to the employees of the Kerala State Rural Development Board with effect from the date of the said Government Order, subject to the condition that no expenditure from the Consolidated Fund of the State will be incurred on that account. Subsequently, the Kerala State Rural Development Board has requested Government to extend the benefit of the above order to certain employees of the Board who have retired from the service of the Board prior to 9-2-1996. On the basis of the above request and on the basis of the direction contained in the judgement of the High Court of Kerala in O.P. No. 15344 of 1995-B, Government have decided to extend the benefit of the pension scheme to the employees of the Board with effect from 5th January, 1994, the date when the Board has made the proposal for pension to the employees of the Board to the Government.

2. In order to give effect to the above proposals amendments to the Kerala State Rural Development Board Act, 1971 were necessary.

3. As the Legislative Assembly of the State of Kerala was not in session and as the proposal had to be given effect to immediately, the Kerala State Rural Development Board (Amendment) Ordinance, 1998, was promulgated by the Governor on the 14th day of June, 1998, and the same was published as Ordinance No. 12 of 1998.

4. The Bill seeks to replace Ordinance No. 12 of 1998 by an Act of the State Legislature.

3. THE KERALA BAMBOO, KATTUVALLI AND PANDANUS LEAF WORKERS' WELFARE FUND BILL, 1998

Bamboo, Kattuvalli and Pandanus Leaf Industries in the State are traditional industries. Most of the persons engaged in the said industries either as workers or as self-employed persons, belong to the poor strata of the society. Government considered it necessary to ensure the well-being and welfare of the weakest and unemployed persons engaged in the said industries. For the said purpose it was decided to constitute a Welfare Fund for giving financial and other assistance to the workers and self-employed persons engaged in the above said industries and also to utilise the said fund to promote the welfare of and pay pension to such workers. For achieving the above said objects it was decided to make a legislation during the current Financial Year itself.

As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and as the proposal had to be given effect to immediately, the Kerala Bamboo, Kattuvalli and Pandanus Leaf Workers' Welfare Fund Ordinance, 1998, was promulgated by the Governor on the 14th day of June, 1998 and published as Ordinance No. 11 of 1998 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 929 dated 15th June, 1998.

The Bill seeks to replace the said Ordinance by an Act of the Legislative Assembly.

4. THE CALCUTT UNIVERSITY (AMENDMENT) AMENDING BILL, 1998

The Senate and the Syndicate of the Calicut University were dissolved by virtue of the provision in sub-section (1) of Section 3 of the Calicut University (Amendment) Act, 1997. Sub-section (2) of the said section provides that the Senate and the Syndicate so dissolved shall be reconstituted in accordance with the provisions of the Calicut University Act, 1975, within a period of one year from the date of such dissolution. The process for the reconstitution of the Senate and Syndicate of the Calicut University as per the provisions of the said Act could not be completed within the stipulated time which expired on the 2nd day of June, 1998. The process for constituting the Senate and Syndicate is underway and it will take some more time to finalise the same. In the circumstances it was considered necessary to extend the due limit of one year for the reconstitution of the said bodies as two years.

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2. At the Legislative Assembly of the State of Kerala was held in session and as the above proposal had to be given effect to immediately, the Calicut University (Amendment) Amending Ordinance, 1996 was promulgated by the Governor on the 2nd day of June, 1996 and the same was published as Government Order No. 9 of 1996 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 102 dated the 2nd day of June, 1996.

3. The Bill seeks to replace Ordinance 9 of 1996 by an Act of the State Legislature.

A. THE KERALA PUBLIC LIBRARIES (KERALA GRANDMASTERS SANGHOM) AMENDMENT BILL, 1996

The Kerala Public Libraries (Kerala Grandmasters Sangham) Act, 1989, envisages three tier system for the administration of libraries in the State, namely the Kerala State Library Council at the State Level, the District Library Councils at the District Level and the Taluk Library Unions at the taluk level. Government have decided to change the name of the 'Taluk Library Union' as 'Taluk Library Council', for the sake of uniformity in the name of the said authorities.

2. The Ex-officio members of the Executive Committee of the State Library Council were not members of the State Library Council. It was considered improper to include persons other than members of the Library Council as members of the Executive Committee thereof. The Executive Committee of the District Library Councils and the Taluk Library Unions consist of members of the said Councils and Unions only. Therefore, it was decided to make the said Ex-officio members as members of the State Library Council first and then to the Executive Committee thereof.

3. Women and members belonging to the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes were not properly represented in the District Library Councils and Taluk Library Unions through provisions made in the Act for the election of women and members belonging to the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes in the said Councils and Unions. Therefore, it was considered necessary to vest powers with the Government to nominate women and members belonging to the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes to the District Library Councils and Taluk Library Councils in the absence of elected members of the categories in those Councils.

4. The term of office of the State Library Council, the District Library Councils and the Taluk Library Unions was originally three years from the date of notification of the constitution of the Councils or the Unions. The said term was extended as 'four years' by Act 1 of 1996. The term so extended expired on 26-4-1998. But elections to the various Councils,

and Unions could not be completed before the said date, as expected. Hence it became necessary to extend the term of the said Councils and Unions as 'five years'.

5. Sub-section (1) of section 4 of the Kerala Public Libraries (Kerala Gramapadala Sangham) Act, 1989, provides that every District Council shall meet at least once in every three months on dates to be fixed by the President of the Council and one of such meeting shall be the annual meeting. Sub-section (1) of section 22 of the said Act provides that every Taluk Library Union shall meet at least once in every two months on dates to be fixed by the President of the Union and one of such meetings shall be the annual meeting. It was decided to provide for the meeting of the said authorities at least twice a year and to treat one of such meeting as the annual meeting as in the case of the State Library Council. It will also decided to fix the quorum for a meeting of the Taluk Library Council as one-fifth of the total number of members of the Council instead of one-third as it exists, to avoid the practical difficulty in holding meetings.

6. Certain other verbal or consequential amendments were also proposed.

7. As the Legislative Assembly of the State of Kerala was not in session and as the above proposals had to be given effect to immediately, the Kerala Public Libraries (Kerala Gramapadala Sangham) Amendment Ordinance, 1998, was promulgated by the Governor on the 20th day of May, 1998, and the same was published as Ordinance No. 8 of 1998 in the Kerala Gazette Extra ordinary No. 750 dated the 22nd May, 1998.

8. The Bill seeks to replace Ordinance No. 8 of 1998 by an Act of the State Legislature.
