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**RESUME OF BUSINESS TRANSACTED DURING THE  
FOURTH SESSION OF THE ELEVENTH KERALA  
LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY**

The summons dated May 20, 2002 for the fourth session of the Eleventh Kerala Legislative Assembly was issued to Members on May 21, 2002. The session commenced at 8.30 a.m. on Wednesday, June 12, 2002 and adjourned sine die at 8.48 p.m. on Friday, August 2, 2002. Even though 37 days of sittings were scheduled as per the Calendar, 3 days of sittings were cancelled. The House met on the following days viz. June 12, 13, 14, 17, 18, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, July 1, 2, 4, 5, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 29, 30, 31, August 1, and 2, 2002 (34 days sittings). The House transacted business for 159 Hours.

#### **Announcement by Hon'ble Speaker:**

On June 24, 2002, the Speaker informed the House that Shri K. P. Rajendrau, M.L.A. who was remanded to custody was released on bail.

On June 27, 2002, the Speaker informed the House that the media persons who were on a strike in protest against the instructions issued on Broadcasting and Telecasting of Assembly proceedings had withdrawn their agitation, and that the instructions issued to the media had not been withdrawn.

### Statements under Rule 300:

On July 22, 2002, Shri M.M. Hassan, Minister for Information and Parliamentary Affairs made a statement under Rule 300 to the effect that there would be a centre in Kerala for C.G.F.N.S. examination for the candidates seeking nursing jobs in America.

### Motion moved by the Chief Minister:

On August 1, 2002, the House unanimously adopted the following motion moved by Shri A. K. Antony, Chief Minister and Leader of the House.

### Correction of answer to Unstarred Question:

On August 2, 2002, corrected answer to Unstarred Question No. 4352 dated 29-7-2002 was laid on the Table by the Minister for Education, as an out of Agenda item.

### Question of Breach of Privilege:

On August 2, 2002, the Speaker informed the House that the following notices of question of breach of privilege were at different stages of consideration:

1. Notice given by Shri Kodiyeri Balakrishnan alleging that the reply given by the Minister for Electricity to Starred Question No. 189 on 25-6-2002 was unfounded.
2. Notice given by Shri V. K. Chandran alleging that the reply given to Unstarred Question No. 1073 dated 25-6-2002 by the Minister for the Welfare of Backward and Scheduled Communities was untruthful.
3. Notice given by Shri Kodiyeri Balakrishnan alleging that the statement, regarding TSP funds, made by the Minister for the Welfare of Backward and Scheduled Communities was unfounded.

## III. *Reference of Bills to Subject Committees and presentation of Subject Committee Reports :*

Out of the twelve Bills referred to the Subject Committees, the Subject Committee Reports of five bills have not been presented in the House. Details of Bills are given in Appendix VII.

## IV. *Bills published and circulated to Members :*

## **Financial Business:**

### (1) *Budget for 2002-2003 :*

The discussion and voting on Demands for Grants in the Budget for the financial year 2002-03 commenced on 24th June, 2002. Thirteen days were allotted for discussion on Demands for Grants.

Out of 1205 cut motions received, 744 were moved and disposed off. There were 232 occasions for speech including reply by the Ministers in connection with the discussion and voting on Demands for Grants.

The Assembly devoted 43 hour and 23 minutes for transacting financial business relating to the Budget for 2002-2003. The details are given in Appendix-IX.

The Appropriation (No. 2) Bill 2002 in respect of the Budget for the year 2002-2003 was introduced by the Minister for Finance on 18-7-2002. The Bill was taken up for consideration on the same day, and was passed without discussion.

- (2) *Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 2002-2003 and Demands for Excess Grants for the years 1985-86, 1987-88, 1988-89, 1989-90, 1990-91, 1991-92, 1992-93 and 1993-94 :*

On July 26th 2002, the Minister for Finance and Excise laid the Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 2002-2003 and Demands for Excess Grants for the years 1985-86, 1987-88, 1988-89, 1989-90, 1990-91, 1991-92, 1992-93 and 1993-94. Discussion and voting on the Supplementary Demands and Demands for Excess Grants took place on July 30th, 2002 and the House devoted 22 minutes for the transaction of the Business.

The Kerala Appropriation (No. 3) Bill, 2002 in respect of Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 2002-2003, and The Kerala Appropriation (Nos. 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 & 11) Bills, 2002 in respect of the Demands for Excess Grants for the years 1985-86, 1987-88, 1988-89, 1989-90, 1990-91, 1991-92, 1992-93 and 1993-94 were introduced, taken into consideration and were passed on July 31, 2002 without discussion in the midst of Pandemonium in the House.

### **Private Members' Business:**

According to the Calendar of sittings of the fourth session of the Eleventh Kerala Legislative Assembly, 7 days were set apart for Private Members' Business i.e. on June 14, 28, July 5, 12, 19, 26 and August 2, 2002. Out of the Private Members' Business transacted only four days since the House adjourned before time on 19th and 26th July, 2002 and the time allotted for 2nd August, 2002 was utilised for Government Business. Out of the four days, two days i.e. 14th June and 5th July were set apart for Private Members Bills and 28th June and 12th July were set apart for Private Members Resolutions.

*Private Members' Bills:*

During the session notice for 17 motions for leave to introduce Bills come up before the House. All the motions for leave to introduce the Bills were opposed by the Minister for Information and Parliamentary Affairs. The motion for leave to introduce six Bills were withdrawn by leave of the House. Discussions on 11 Bills were inconclusive.

Details regarding the name of members who moved the motion for leave to introduce the Bills and the Results thereof are given in Appendix X-A and X-B.

*Private Members' Resolutions:*

During the session, notice for six resolutions given by Shri K. P. Rajendran, Shri K. N. A. Khader, Shri Mathai Chacko, Shri Mangode Radhakrishnan, Shri T. U. Radhakrishnan and Shri Oommen Chandi were received. Discussion on Resolution given notice by Shri K. V. Kunjiraman which was partially discussed in the previous session was continued, and was put to vote and declared lost. Resolutions of Shri Mathai Chacko and Shri Oommen Chandi were not moved for want of time. Resolution of Shri K. P. Rajendran and Shri Mangode Radhakrishnan were rejected by the House. The Resolution moved by Shri K. N. A. Khader was adopted unanimously. Discussion on the Resolution given notice by Shri T. U. Radhakrishnan was inconclusive.

## APPENDIX VI

Salient features <sup>of</sup> the Bills Passed**THE KERALA GENERAL SALES TAX (AMENDMENT)  
BILL, 2002**

As per the decision taken by the Empowered Committee of State Finance Ministers on Tax Reforms and introduction of Value Added Tax (VAT) in India, tax on certain items under the Kerala General Sales Tax Act, 1963, which are below the uniform floor rates as adopted by the Government of India, had to be enhanced, so as to have a uniform rate of tax for such items. This required amendments to certain entries in the First and Third Schedules to the Kerala General Sales Tax Act, 1963.

2. Considering the urgency of the matter, the Kerala General Sales Tax (Amendment) Ordinance, 2001 was promulgated by the Governor on 29th December, 2001 and was published as Ordinance No. 37 of 2001 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 2093, dated the 31st December, 2001. A Bill to replace the said Ordinance could not be introduced in, and passed by, the Legislative Assembly in its next session. In order to keep alive the provisions of the said Ordinance, the Kerala General Sales Tax (Amendment) Ordinance, 2002 was promulgated by the Governor on the 11th day of April, 2002 and was published as Ordinance No. 4 of 2002 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 452 dated the 11th April, 2002.

3. In the Budget speech 2002-2003, the Government have announced its policy to replace the Single Point Taxation system adopted for petroleum products coming under Serial Number 108 of the First Schedule to the Kerala General Sales Tax Act, 1963 by double point taxation system. Accordingly provisions were incorporated in the Finance Bill, 2002 for the same, which came into force with effect from 1st April, 2002. However due to the dismantling of the Administered Pricing Mechanism (APM) by the Government of India with effect from the 1st April, 2002, it has become necessary to reconsider the double point taxation system in respect of petroleum products, as aforesaid. On analysis of the price structure adopted by Oil Companies after the Budget announcement and also the realisable revenue therefrom, it was found that it would be more advantageous for the Government to have single point tax system for petroleum products. Since Sales Tax from petroleum products constitutes about 33% of the total sales tax revenue, Government have decided to reintroduce the single point taxation system for petroleum products instead of the double point system introduced by the Finance Bill, 2002.

4. In order to carryout the above changes it has become necessary further to amend the Kerala General Sales Tax Act, 1963, suitably.

5. Accordingly, the Kerala General Sales Tax (Second Amendment) Ordinance was promulgated by the Governor in the 2nd day of April, 2002 and was published as Ordinance No. 2 of 2002 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 398 dated the 3rd April, 2002.

6. This Bill seeks to replace Ordinance Nos. 2 and 4 of 2002 by an Act of the State Legislature.

### **THE KERALA WOMEN'S COMMISSION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2002**

As part of economy measures and restructuring of various Commissions the Council of Ministers in its proceedings dated 19-12-2001, have decided that the number of members of the Commission in the State shall be confined to three. This decision applies to the Kerala Women's Commission as well. By its decision dated 20-2-2002, the Council of Ministers have also decided that fixed honorarium shall be paid to the Chairperson and members instead of salary, without having regard to their past service, if any, and also to fix the quorum for the meeting of the Commission as two, commensurate with the downsizing of the Commission. In order to give effect to the above decision, the Kerala Women's Commission Act, 1990 has to be suitably amended.

2. As the Legislative Assembly of the State of Kerala was not in session and as the above decision had to be given effect to immediately, the Governor of Kerala has promulgated the Kerala Women's Commission (Amendment) Ordinance, 2002 on the 19th day of April, 2002 and the same was published as Ordinance No. 5 of 2002 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 510 dated the 20th April, 2002.

3. The Bill seeks to replace the said Ordinance by an Act of the State Legislature.

### **THE KERALA INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT FUND (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2002**

Section 9 of the Kerala Infrastructure Investment Fund Act, 1999 provides that the total guarantee issued by the Government for the payment of the principal and interest of any loan proposed to be raised by the Board under section 8 shall not exceed a sum of rupees one thousand crores. It has been decided by the Government to raise the authorised capital of the Fund constituted under the scheme as per section 3 of the said Act from rupees five hundred crores to rupees one thousand crores. Therefore when the authorised capital is increased, the limit of the Government guarantee of the loan raised

by Board has also to be increased. For this, it has been decided by Government to amend the said Act by increasing the limit of the guarantee under section 8 from rupees one thousand crores to rupees two thousand crores.

2. As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and the amendment had to be brought into force immediately, the Kerala Infrastructure Investment Fund (Amendment) Ordinance, 2002 was promulgated by the Governor and was published as Ordinance No. 1 of 2002 on 18th January, 2002.

3. A Bill to replace the said Ordinance by an Act of the Legislature could not be introduced in and passed by the Eleventh Legislative Assembly in its third session for want of time.

4. WHEREAS, it would face difficulties if the provisions of the said Ordinance were not kept alive, the Kerala Infrastructure Investment Fund Ordinance, 2002 was promulgated by the Governor by incorporating the provisions of the said Ordinance and was published as Ordinance No. 3 of 2002 on 11th April, 2002.

5. This bill seeks to replace Ordinance No. 3 of 2002 by an Act of the State Legislature.

### **THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 2) BILL, 2002**

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204(1) of the Constitution of India, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys required to meet the expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State and the Grants made by the Legislative Assembly in respect of the estimated expenditure of the Government of Kerala for the Financial year 2002-2003.

### **THE KERALA CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2002**

Government had appointed a Committee with Sri K. R. Aravindakshan as its Chairman to study the organisational set up and working of the Primary, Central and State Co-operative Banks/Societies in the State. The Committee recommended among other things to amend certain provisions of the Kerala Co-operative Societies Act, 1969. After considering the recommendations Government decided to bring in certain amendments to the Kerala Co-operative Societies Act, 1969, mainly for the following purposes, namely:—

(i) to include all classes of Primary Societies, and Central and Federal Societies having headquarters in the district, as the members of the concerned District Co-operative Bank:

(ii) to revive the membership of Primary Societies in the District Co-operative Banks which was lost consequent on the enactment of the Kerala Co-operative Societies (Second Amendment) Act, 1997:

(iii) to give voting right in the affairs of the Society to all the members of the Societies;

(iv) to provide in the Act for the election of President, Vice-President, Treasurer and other officers of the Society and for removal of such officers by a no confidence motion carried by the Committee.

(v) to dissolve the existing committees of the District Co-operative Banks and to reconstitute them in accordance with the proposed changes in the Act.

2. It was also considered necessary to make provisions for giving pensionary benefits to the employees of the societies who have retired during the period between 1-1-1974 and 3-6-1993.

3. As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and as the proposals had to be given effect to immediately the Kerala Co-operative Societies (Amendment) Ordinance, 2002 was promulgated by the Governor on the 4th day of May, 2002 and was published as Ordinance No. 6 of 2002 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 589 dated 4th May, 2002.

4. The Bill seeks to replace the said Ordinance by an Act of the State Legislature.

### **THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 3) BILL, 2002**

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to authorise payment and appropriation of certain further sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala required to meet the supplementary expenditure charged on the consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala and the grants made by the Legislative Assembly for the expenditure of the Government of Kerala for the Financial Year 2002-2003.

### **THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 4) BILL, 2002**

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys to meet the amounts spent on certain services in excess of the amounts granted for those services for the Financial Year 1985-86.

### **THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 5) BILL, 2002**

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys to meet the amounts spent on certain services in excess of the amounts granted for those services for the Financial Year 1987-88.

### **THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 6) BILL, 2002**

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys to meet the amounts spent on certain services in excess of the amounts granted for those services for the Financial Year 1988-89.

### **THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 7) BILL, 2002**

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys to meet the amounts spent on certain services in excess of the amounts granted for those services for the Financial Year 1989-90.

### **THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 8) BILL, 2002**

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys to meet the amounts spent on certain services in excess of the amounts granted for those services for the Financial Year 1990-91.

### **THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 9) BILL, 2002**

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys to meet the amounts spent on certain services in excess of the amounts granted for those services for the Financial Year 1991-92.

### **THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 10) BILL, 2002**

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys to meet the amounts spent on certain services in excess of the amounts granted for those services for the Financial Year 1993-94.

### **THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 11) BILL, 2002**

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys to meet the amounts spent on certain services in excess of the amounts granted for those services for the financial year 1993-94.

### **THE KERALA GROUND WATER (CONTROL AND REGULATION) BILL, 2002**

Where water is to be used for various purposes, dependance on ground water has increased in the State now a days. Studies in this regard have proved that this type of excess consumption has been the reason for the regular lowering of the level of ground water in certain areas of the State. This type of excess use of ground water will create serious problems in future. Therefore Government are satisfied that it is necessary to protect ground water and to regulate its exploitation and consumption. In addition to this, the Central Government have already pointed out the necessity of considering seriously about legislation by the State Government for the regulation of excess consumption of ground water at important centres of human inhabitation and other important places.

In these circumstances, the Government consider it necessary to bring in a special legislation for the protection of ground water and for the regulation and control of its exploitation and consumption.



### **THE KERALA FINANCE BILL, 2002**

The Bill seeks to amend the following enactments to give effect to certain financial proposals of the Government of Kerala for the financial year 2002-2003, namely:—

1. The Abkari Act (10 of 1977)
2. The Kerala General Sales Tax Act, 1963 (15 of 1963)
3. The Kerala Chitties Act, 1975 (23 of 1975)
4. The Kerala Tax on Luxuries Act, 1976 (32 of 1976)
5. The Kerala Agricultural Income Tax Act, 1991 (15 of 1991)
6. The Kerala Tax on Entry of Goods into Local Areas Act, 1994 (15 of 1994).

### **THE KERALA LOADING AND UNLOADING (PROHIBITION OF EXTORTIONARY, INTIMIDATORY OR OTHER UNLAWFUL PRACTICES) BILL, 2002**

[The title of the Bill has been changed as The Kerala Loading and Unloading (Regulation of Wages and Restriction of Unlawful Practices) Bill, 2002.]

The Kerala Headload Workers Act, 1978 was aimed at creating an administrative machinery to regulate the employment of headload workers, a dispute setting mechanism and a welfare scheme for these workers. The said Act has been in existence for two decades and is time proven. Over a period of time because of lack of regulation certain undesirable practices have arisen in the loading and unloading sector. Intention of the proposed legislation is to curb such practices.

2. Accordingly, the basic objective of this legislation is to lay down the type of activities, the eligibility of the workers, the rights of employers, wages, penalties and procedure for initiating criminal prosecution. It prohibits extortionary, intimidatory or other unlawful practices connected with loading and unloading and transportation of goods and articles both in the domestic and non-domestic sectors. Criminal prosecution is only one of the features of this legislation and is not the sole purpose of this Act. The provisions of this legislation are such that, it is to be expected that the enforcement of this legislation itself would bring to an end, the undesirable practices and occasions for invoking the provisions of criminal penalties and procedure would be seldom.

3. The Bill is intended to achieve the above objects.
